- Was instrumental in creating the position of an independent ethics commissioner reporting directly to Parliament.
- Launched a major *Greening of the Federal Government* initiative, with immediate action committing: (i) all new and retrofitted Federal Government buildings (some 70 million square feet) to meet the LEED Gold environmental certification; (ii) all new vehicles purchased in his Department, and most across government, to be Low Emission Vehicles; and (iii) an increasing proportion of the Federal Government's \$1billion/month procurement budget to sustainable purchasing standards.
- Hosted a ground-breaking *Environmental Technology Forum* with Prime Minister Paul Martin to bring together leaders from Western Canada's diverse environmental technology sector to develop strategies for product and market development, and ensure Canada remains an international leader in environmental technology and solutions to critical global challenges.
